Since 2010, we have been dedicated to empowering youth with intellectual disabilities in the Bethlehem Governorate, supporting them in building independence, strengthening social connections, and growing in confidence.

Al-Malath provides comprehensive rehabilitative services, including vocational training, physical therapy, occupational therapy, and special education for persons with intellectual disabilities and older adults. These programs help beneficiaries gain independence and secure a meaningful place in society.

We proudly support those who are often overlooked, offering hope where few others do. Young children diagnosed with autism receive specialized care and opportunities to grow in a nurturing and structured environment. Our mission remains clear: to empower every life we touch and create a safe environment where potential is realized and dignity is restored.



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Our Activities

Al-Malath continues to work with full strength providing rehabilitation services to all beneficiaries .Despite the existing challenges, it continues to deliver its services to more than 20 beneficiaries.

Work with children diagnosed with autism continues, and we remain committed to receiving new cases. Families report noticeable developmental progress through continuous follow-up and parental engagement.

Production and distribution of traditional Palestinian sweets, including Hareeseh, also continue as part of our vocational and income-generating activities, with products supplied to local restaurants.

Throughout the year, occupational therapy students from Bethlehem University, Palestine Ahliya University, and Hebron Polytechnic University complete their field training at Al-Malath under the supervision of university instructors and our in-house occupational therapy specialists.

Staff members participated in a training workshop on the behavioral development assessment tool in partnership with QADER for Community Development. The training included five sessions held in November and December 2025, attended by the special education specialist and the autism class specialist.

In addition, staff members joined governance and management training courses organized by the General Union.

This transition reflects our commitment, determination, and ability to adapt quickly in order to ensure continuity of care.
